Master Association Adopts \$4 Dues Increase for 2023

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association Board adopted the 2023 Master Association Budget with a \$4 per month dues increase, which equates to a total of \$64 each month to cover increased operational expenses, fire mitigation efforts and perimeter fence improvements in 2023. Approximately \$1 of the monthly dues increase will go toward fire mitigation, including interface mowing, home assessments and woody vegetation removal. Approximately \$3 per month will go toward perimeter fence improvements. The approved budget has been posted on our website at www.ken-carylranch.org under the About Us tab, then Financials. Dues will increase beginning Jan. 1, 2023. Residents, who are not currently set up on automatic ACH payments, are kindly reminded to update their dues payments accordingly. Radon Mitigation Systems

There are several residents who have installed Radon Mitigation systems for various reasons. This is just a friendly reminder to please obtain approval from the HOA <u>before</u> installing such a system. These exterior vents require installation that does not interfere with neighbor patio spaces and matches the existing structure. The HOA will guide you through appropriate placement of these systems. WHAT IF YOU HAVE AN EMERGENCY AND THE FIRE DEPARTMENT OR AMBULANCE CAN'T GET TO YOUR HOUSE???

That is exactly what happens (and has happened) in Sunset Ridge when cars are parked unattended behind townhomes. Our alleys are designated as Fire Lanes for a reason. Please don't be the reason your neighbor can't get help! In an emergency, a few minutes can make a big difference in someone's life or saving a home.

Emergency vehicles are often accompanied by a Jefferson County Sheriff's Deputy who can issue a citation for "Impeding Emergency Vehicles." To report vehicles parked in alleys, call or text Paul Laird at 303-419-6005 with address and photo of vehicle. Illegally parked vehicles are subject to fines and/or towing.

Also....if your car is parked behind your townhome when the snowplow comes, the plow cannot get behind your or your neighbor's units.

WINTERIZE!

Ice Melt:

We recently have had several requests to repair stoops, stairs and sidewalks. Most of these are original concrete work which means that they are at least 30 years old. The damage done to the surface is largely due to age and weather. Concrete is a porous material. When it rains or snows, water seeps into the pores of the concrete. Then, when the temperature drops and the water freezes, the water expands and pushes the surface apart, causing visible damage. Water is unique, in that most materials contract when cold, but water actually expands in cold temperatures. Ice melt contributes to this problem, because it causes ice and snow to melt at lower temperatures. The water then can seep into the concrete and re-freeze

Then, when you turn on the faucet in the spring, water may flood your basement.

HERE COMES THE SUN



If you happen to be outside at 2:47 P.M. on December 21st, check out your shadow. It's the longest shadow you will cast all year. Winter Solstice which occurs on December 21st, marks the beginning of winter in the Northern Hemisphere and is the shortest day of the year. Most people think the event spans the entire day, but it actually lasts only a moment—the moment when the earth is tilted as far from the sun as it can be.

Different cultures have celebrated the solstice since ancient times. The Roman Feast of Saturnalia honored the agriculture god Saturn and was a week-long celebration with feasts, gift giving, games and fun. The Feast of Juul (Yule) refers to a pre-Christian festival in Scandinavia which included feasting, caroling and a ceremonial burning of logs to welcome the sun back to the world.

In China, Dongzhi Festival celebrates the arrival of winter. The Hopi Indians of Northern Arizona recognize the solstice with Soyal Ceremonies where they welcome protective spirits from the mountains, known as Kachinas. The Festival

of Lohri is celebrated by the Sikh community in India on the solstice. Bonfires are lit and people sing and dance until the flames die out.

No matter where one lives in the Northern Hemisphere, Winter Solstice is a time to look forward to longer days and eventually warmer days of spring.

WINTER IS THE SEASON FOR HOME FIRES



Most sources agree on the most common causes of fires in the home and that winter is an especially dangerous time.

Cooking fires account for 48 percent of residential fires. Common fire risks are curtains, towel racks or even paper towel dispensers too close to burners. If you don't already have one, buy a fire extinguisher to keep within easy reach when you're cooking. Remember: Do NOT toss water on a grease fire—smoother it.

Home heating equipment is involved in one of every six home fires and one in five deaths. Make certain to keep anything that gives off heat at least three feet away from flammable material. Check and clean your fireplace every year and use a metal or glass screen large enough to prevent escaping embers.

Although beautiful, candles are extremely dangerous. Never leave them unattended while burning. The same goes for heating appliances.



Dryers are responsible for nine out of ten appliance fires. Clean you filter after every load and get your external dryer vent cleaned regularly. WE HAVE HAD FIRES DUE TO CLOGGED DRYER VENTS IN SUNSET RIDGE!

Basements, garages and storage areas can present fire hazards. Clean clutter or debris away from your furnace or heater. Gas or flammable liquids should be tightly sealed in metal containers away from heat sources. Gas/charcoal grills should be ten feet from your home and away from overhead branches or structures.

Have your family practice escape routes that provide two exit plans from each room. Practice your plan at least twice a year.

A little precaution produces a safe, cozy home during cold winter months.
